Happy New Year!

Deep in our Methodist heritage is the practice of recommitting our lives to Christ at the beginning of each year. John Wesley believed this was an essential part of being a "Methodist"; an annual renewal of our covenant vows found in the baptismal liturgy. Not a re-baptism, but a re-commitment to being wholly in connection with Christ. Over the course of my tenure at Otterbein, we have used the full Wesley Covenant Service once; liturgically it is suggested for use at a New Year's Eve service. We have also had a baptism renewal service early in the year. The Sunday after Epiphany, Baptism of the Lord, has been a date we have used. While we have not been liturgically regular with these practices, I think the idea of recommitment at the beginning of a new year is great. While the idea of our faith fading away as a year goes on is not true, it is always good to come back to the things that ground us. We do this corporately through the church calendar, Christmas and Easter being touchstones to God's work in creation, Incarnation, and Resurrection, showing us again and again that God loved us so much to live with us and restore us.

Our personal faith needs those moments as well and sometimes those corporate moments work just fine, but occasionally we need more. For me it has always been communion. A corporate practice, but yet very personal.

One loaf, one cup shared by all, but still given to an individual. John Wesley's Covenant Renewal Prayer is much the same. Shared in community, but exceedingly personal in nature. I've included a portion of the prayer below. Maybe it can be something you use to center your celebration of the New Year.

I am no longer my own, but thine.

Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt.

Put me to doing, put me to suffering.

Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee,
exalted for thee or brought low for thee.

Let me be full, let me be empty.

Let me have all things, let me have nothing.

I freely and heartily yield all things
to thy pleasure and disposal.

And now, O glorious and blessed God,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,
thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it.

And the covenant which I have made on earth,
let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.


